Austin's 2010 Boat Show was a huge success. It was great seeing some of you there. Lakeway Marina & Riviera Marina had the 1958 Commando boat that was found at Riviera Marina during August of 2009 on display. We are in the process of restoring the boat with hopes to have it finished by Austin's 2011 Boat Show. For those of you who were unable to attend this year's show, we thought we'd share with you the story and pictures that were on display at our booths. Hope you enjoy this as much as many of the attendees of the show did.

During 2009, Lake Travis faced the second worst drought in the lakes' history; reaching a low of 629 feet above sea level (which is 52' low). The record low was 614' in 1951. Full pool for Lake Travis is 681 feet above sea level. Every marina and its' staff on Lake Travis faced their most difficult summer ever! There was not one marina that was spared some sort of heartache or financial burden from the drought.

In August of 2009, Lakeway Marina and Riviera Marina found two vintage fiberglass boats that had been sunk to the bottom of the lake. There's no telling how long they've been there!

The boat at Riviera Marina was found in the Cypress Creek Cove. The boat at Lakeway Marina was found under its' ships store. Both marinas retrieved the boats and all the employees gathered around to check out what we had found. After a long summer, it was a nice break and put smiles on all our faces. One of the boats was a 1958 Commando made by National Marine Plastics and the other is a 1950's President made by A.R.A out of Grand Prairie, TX.

Lakeway Marina and Riviera Marina decided that there is a silver lining to everything! So the marinas are going to restore this 1958 Commando to its' original condition. Due to the fact we are still dealing with low water issues, this is as far as we've reached on this project. We decided to share this story with everyone in hopes to put a smile on some faces.

Lake Travis is on its' way back to being a beautiful full lake again. The lake is currently at 655' and still rising.
